★		<b>Fredericksburg Visitors Center</b> Built in 1824 by Anthony Kale. He used it for his home and shop.
1	F-4	<b>Fredericksburg Baptist Church</b> Established in 1767, it was used as a hospital during the Civil War.
2	B-6	<b>Brompton</b> Used during the Civil War and now is the home of the president of Mary Washington College.
3	H-5	<b>Center for Creative Arts</b> (Silversmith House)

4	H-4	<b>Chatham</b>
5	D-4	<b>Confederate Cemetery</b> 1,000 Confederate soldiers buried here. Many are unknown.
6	F-5	<b>Courthouse (1852)</b> Built in 1852 by architect James Renwick.
7	H-7	<b>Ferry Farm</b>
8	F-4	<b>Fredericksburg Area Museum</b> (Town Hall & Market House) Exhibits Fredericksburg History

15	D-2	<b>Mary Washington Grave and Monument</b> Built as a burial marker and dedicated in 1894 by President Grover Cleveland.
